Harden the Target

- The first step to "harden the target" is to make your home much more difficult to enter.
- Burglars want to get in & out quickly
- Your home is your castle where you should feel safe and it's the only environment where
 you have control over who can get close to you or your family.
- Criminals will bypass your home if it requires too much effort or requires more skills and/ or more tools then they possess.
 - A. Perimeter
 - B. Foundation of the Home
 - C. Inside the home
 - D. Property

Perimeter

<u>Lights</u>

- Lights around the perimeter of your home especially at entry points
- Motion lights and Solar lights are a good alternative

Garages, Gates & Fences

- Keep them closed and <u>locked</u>
- Garages are the weakest point of entry
- Don't keep house keys in your car burglars will always search the cars for keys and valuables

Shrubs/Plants

Shrubbery and plants provides excellent coverage for a criminal

Foundation of the Home

Most criminals enter via the back of the home.

- Doors
 - Exterior Doors and Locks (info in handout will discuss the type of locks and strike plates)
 - Peepholes
 - Never open your door to a stranger DEMAND identification
 - · Make sure you tell your children also NOT to answer the door
 - · You don't have to open the door to talk to the people You can talk to them through the door
 - Video Door Bells* there are several on the market*
- Windows need to be kept locked
- Alarms
 - Alarms only work when they are used
 - Maintain the Alarm Permit

Home

- Other Openings <u>Pet Doors</u>
- Dogs
 - Dogs can scare away criminal and can be a secondary security system but they can also be lured away, poisoned, or killed.
- Surveillance Cameras
 - Camera can be very helpful*
 - Let your neighborhood security liaisons know if you have a camera
- Video Door Bells *

Personal Property

- Photograph your valuables
- Document the make, model and serial numbers of items and <u>personal id number</u>
- Hide jewelry, computers, guns keep them away from windows

Away from Home

- Alert Slip
- Vacation Watch —> SEAL Security
- Put a hold on your Mail and other Deliveries
- Give the appearance that your home is occupied
 - Light timers
 - Garbage cans

Other Measures

- Keys make sure locks are changed when you change ownership
- Social Media Do Not broadcast when you're on vacation, nor even if you're going on a day trip. Put photo's and notices AFTER you come back.
- Notify your neighbors its good to have nosy neighbors
 - Pickup mail, park their car in your driveway
 - Vacation Watch
- Flashlight -high lumen flashlight use it to shine out your window at night or when shined in someones eyes it and cause momentary blindness.

Burglarized

- Burglars go to the bedroom where most people keep their valuables
 - Be unpredictable in hiding your valuables
- Burglars get in & out quickly but if you come home and suspect something do not enter your home - call 911
